Introduction



We are the **Arts Council of Wales**. We want the arts to be a big part of life in Wales.



One way we do this is by giving **funds** for arts projects.

A **fund** is money that organisations can get to help them do their work.



We have a **fund** called the **Capital Programme**.



We got this **fund** from the **National Lottery**.



This **fund** helps arts organisations get the right buildings or equipment for their work.

About this document



This document will help you to apply for the **Capital Programme fund.**



In this document we will be using the word, '**your project**'. **Your project** is what you want the **fund** for. For example, your project might be to get new lights for a theatre.



Projects can be hard to plan and organise. We have officers to help you.



We also have up to date information on our website: <u>arts.wales/funding</u>.



You should read our Capital Strategy 2021-2017. This will tell you about our plans. And what we want this **fund** to be used for.







What the fund is for

We want this **fund** to make the Welsh arts better.

Our goals are:

1. For the Welsh arts to be **inclusive** and **accessible**.

Inclusive means everyone can take part, and everyone has a fair chance.

Accessible means it is easy to go somewhere. And to get around. It also means something is easy to understand.

2. For the Welsh arts to be strong and long lasting.



3. For us to work with more creative people across Wales.

Who can apply



Only arts organisations in Wales can apply for this **fund**. Your project must be in Wales too.

Your organisation must:



- Have at least two people who run it. They cannot be related or live at the same address.



•

Have an up to date and legal **equal** opportunities policy.



Have a bank account that at least two people oversee.

- Have done arts projects before.

You cannot apply for the **fund** if you owe us any money.

You must upload your governing document when you apply. Unless you already gave it to us in the last 2 years.

Your governing document will show us that:

- You are properly set up. And can manage money well.
- You have a plan for what would happen if you closed down.

You must be a member of Arts Portfolio Wales to apply.

If not, we might still consider your project. But you will need to check with us first.









What we will pay for



You can use this **fund** for things that are useful for your business. Like:

- Buildings
- Equipment
- Vehicles



You can use this **fund** to buy or improve these things.



For example, you might want to improve your theatre by making it more **accessible**.



You need to tell us how your project will make things better.



We might also pay for:

- Professionals or experts. If you can show they will improve your project.
- Artists or craftspeople.
- Tax that you can't claim back from the government.
- Legal costs for your project.
- Costs for changing where or how you work. If it is unexpected.



We might change what we can **fund** at any time. Before you apply, check our website for the most up to date information.

What we will not pay for

This fund will not pay for:

- Buying musical instruments.
- Doing up council or school buildings that do not fit with our plans.
- Permanent arts or cultural projects.
- Things you paid for already. Or things you agreed to pay for already.
- Normal costs to do your work. Like insurance, maintenance or for an accountant.
- Money you are charged for help with this application.

The following projects are not as important to us:



 New buildings. We prefer to use this fund to improve existing buildings.



 Community buildings used for lots of different projects. We prefer to give this fund to buildings that only do arts projects.





You must use proper procedures to get goods or services.



If you don't use proper procedures, we won't **fund** these goods or services.




Make sure your project costs are right when you apply.



If you need more money later, we can't give it to you.

What you can apply for

The Capital Programme has 3 different funds:





•

-

for small building projects

We call these minor capital projects.



for big building projects.

We call these major capital projects.



How you apply is different for each **fund**. The amount of money you get is different for each **fund**.

Buying equipment

You can apply for this **fund** if you want to get new equipment.

Or improve equipment you already have.

If you apply for up to **50 thousand pounds**, it should be for things like:

- equipment for theatres
- technical equipment for exhibitions
- dance floors you can move
- vehicles.

If you apply for up to **100 thousand pounds**, it should be for things like:

- getting brand new light and sound equipment
- new digital projection equipment
- new stage equipment.

The most money you can apply for is 100 thousand pounds.








Minor capital projects



This **fund** is for small building projects.



You can use it to make your building better. And help your business to last a long time.



- making changes so you can have new technology in your building
- improving your restaurant or café area



- doing up parts of the building so it looks nicer for customers
- making your building more **accessible**.



You can use this **fund** for things to do with Covid 19.

Like putting up signs. Or making the air quality better.



You can use this **fund** to make your building better for the **environment**.

The **environment** is where we live. It includes the land, the sea, the air, and everything that lives in and on it. For example, plants, animals, and fish.



For example, improving your building so it uses less heating or electricity.



The most money you can apply for is **100** thousand pounds.



Major capital projects

This **fund** is for much bigger building projects.



We will only give this **fund** to few projects.



These projects must make a big difference to the arts all over Wales.



You can apply for **100 thousand pounds or more**.



But we will let you know exactly how much money we can give you.



We will work very closely with you to plan your project.

More information about these funds



We will only give you money for **part** of your project. We won't ever pay for it all.



We are more likely to help you if you have **funds** from other places too.



If you have **funds** from other partners, it shows us you have a good idea.

Other places you could get help and **funds** from:

- your own money
- fundraising
- money from other partners
- money from the Government
- other lottery funds
- things you get for free. Like work by volunteers.
 Or equipment donations.

You can apply once a year to the **Capital Programme**.



You must talk to one of our officers before you apply.



Our officers will tell you the rules for your particular project.



There is **no deadline** to apply for the **Capital Programme**.



But there might be deadlines for some parts of the **funds**.

Applications for major capital projects are in 3 stages:



•

check your project is possible to do. And worth doing

plan the details of your project

work out the costs.



We will check your application at each stage to make sure it is right.

First you need to register to use our online portal. Register by clicking here <u>portal.arts.wales</u>.



Then you can apply for the **Capital Programme** using the online portal.

We will let you know when we get your application.



We will let you know if your project fits with our plans. And if anything is missing.



If your project fits with our plans, we will then decide if we can **fund** it.

How we decide what projects to fund

We have rules to decide what projects we will **fund**. We will check:

- If your project fits with our goals and plans.
- If your project meets a need.
- If you have a good quality project.
- If your project helps people.
- If your project is **accessible**.

We will also check:

- How strong your organisation is.
- If we think you can plan and manage a project well.
- If we think the project will be successful.
- How you will deal with any problems.



You should read **The Capital Programme - Help with your application**. This will tell you what you should tell us in your application.



Rules

Who decides what projects to fund



We have different people to decide what projects to **fund**.



It depends on the amount of money. And what it is for.



For up to **50 thousand pounds** for equipment, an **officer group** will decide.



Our **capital committee** will decide about all other equipment applications.



Our **capital committee** will decide about minor and major capital projects.



For major capital projects of **more than 250 thousand pounds**, the **council** will decide.



What happens next

If your application is successful, we will let you know.



We will also let you know if we need any more information.



You must agree to certain things before we give you any money.



For **major capital projects** you will need to sign a contract.



If your application is not successful, we will let you know why.



You can talk to us about our reasons if you want to.



How we check your project

We will need to check that you spend the lottery **funds** properly.



How we check will depend on the type of project you have.



We will do more detailed checks on bigger projects.



If you don't spend the money properly, you might need to pay it back.
